Semester System

2 Semesters per Year:

Course Load: 4 courses per semester

Standard Courses: Typically worth 5 credits each CTS Courses: Consist of five 1-credit modules, assigned by teachers during the first few weeks.

Crescent Heights Course Path

Students usually complete their high school diploma in 3 years:

- Grade 10: 40 credits (8 courses)
- Grade 11: 35-40 credits (7-8 courses)
- Grade 12: 30 credits (6 courses)



Course Prerequisites

- A minimum grade of 50% is required to advance to the next course level.
- A grade of 60-65% is recommended for better preparation.


HOW DO I KNOW WHICH PATHWAY TO TAKE?

ALBERTA HIGH SCHOOL DIPLOMA



What do you need to graduate with an Alberta High School Diploma?

- 100 credits or more (each class is typically 5 credits)
- ELA to Grade 12 (30 level)
- Social Studies to Grade 12 (30 level)
- Math to Grade 11 (20 level)
- Science to Grade 11 (20 level)
- PE 10
- Calm and Life Management 20 (Calm)
- 10 credits in Complementary Courses (CTS, Fine Arts, Second Languages, PE 20 & 30)
- 10 credits at the 30 level in addition to ELA and Social Studies

What do I need to know about pathways?


The Alberta High School Diploma pathways offer two main tracks: -1 and -2.

- The -1 pathway is for students aiming for university or college and includes more advanced courses.
- The -2 pathway is for students who are focusing on careers or technical training, offering more practical, hands-on learning opportunities.
- Both pathways lead to a high school diploma, but the course levels differ based on your future goals.
- Your counsellors can help you transition from one pathway to another
- The arrows in the following diagrams will help you see what are possible moves!







Math 10-3 Plus

Course Purpose: Math 10-3 Plus is for students with mixed achievement in Grade 9 math, helping them build skills for high school math success.

Course Structure: Students complete Math 10-3 outcomes, then receive introductory instruction to prepare for Math 10C if desired.

Next Steps: After completing Math 10-3 Plus, students can take Math 20-3 or, with teacher and counselor approval, attempt Math 10C.

Course Label: The course appears as "Mathematics 10" on timetables but awards Math 10-3 credit upon completion.



Comparison with Math 15: Math 15 reviews middle school math for Math 10C readiness, while Math 10-3 Plus teaches Math 10-3 and offers Math 10C prep. Consider which best fits your needs.
