



CHHS Grade 11 & 12 Senior High Core Course Transition Guide

What do you need to be awarded an Alberta High School Diploma?

- 100 credits or more (each class is typically 5 credits)
- ELA to grade 12 (30 level)
- Social Studies to grade 12 (30 level)
- Math to grade 11 (20 level)
- Science to grade 11 (20 level)
- PE 10
- Career and Life Management (CALM)
- 10 credits in options (CTC, Fine Arts, Second Languages, PE 20 and 30 Courses)
- 10 credits at the 30 level in addition to ELA and Social Studies 30

Post-secondary institutions admission requirements vary. We encourage you to attend information sessions at Crescent Heights High School, attend Post-Secondary open houses and meet with your Guidance Counselor to discuss possible pathways and opportunities to meet your goals.

We strongly encourage students to review next core course recommendations if they are available. Teachers often put these in PowerSchool when you register for next year courses or they can reach out to their current teachers to get their thoughts.

Crescent Heights Registration Tips

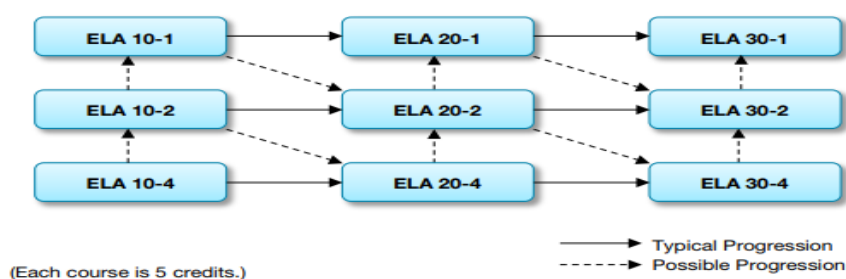
Students with marks above 65 in the prerequisite course are more likely to be successful in following courses: ELA 20-1, SS 20-1, Biology 20, Chemistry 20, Physics 20, ELA 30-1, SS 30-1, Math 30-1, Biology 30, Chemistry 30, and Physics 30.

Students with marks above 75 in Math 10C are more likely to be successful in Math 20-1. Students with marks above 75 in Math 20-1 are more likely to be successful in Math 30-1.

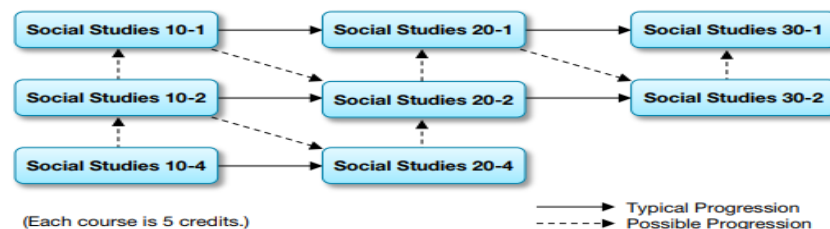
In all courses you need a mark of 50 or above to progress to the next grade level. If you achieved a mark of 40-49 in a class please see your counsellor to discuss retroactive credits or explore other options.

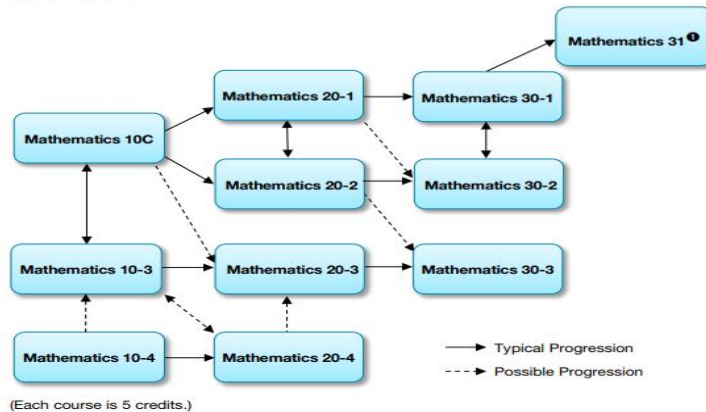
English Language Arts (ELA) Program



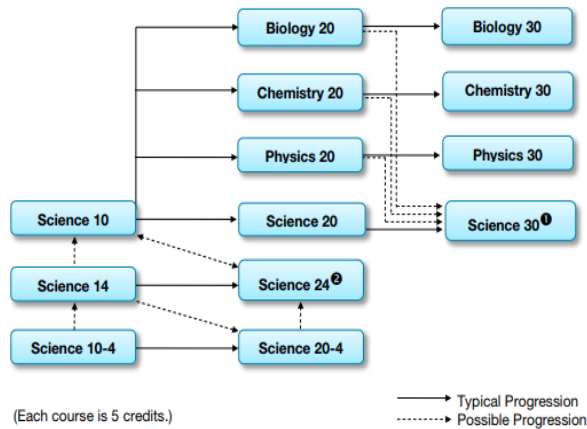
Social Studies Program

Certificate of High School Achievement – Knowledge and Employability Program

This certificate was designed by Alberta Education for students who learn best through experiences that integrate essential and employability skills in occupational contexts. These courses provide students opportunities to enter employment or to build confidence and develop skills to transition to a High School Diploma. Classes are taught in smaller settings with additional support and an assigned Guidance Counsellor Coordinator to personalize their timetable and work towards the student's goals.

Requirements:

- 80 credits or more
- ELA 20-2 or 30-4
- Math 10-3 or 20-4
- Science 14 or 20-4
- Social Studies 10-2 or 20-4
- PE 10
- Career and Life Management (CALM)
- 5 credits in CTC 30 level courses
- 5 credits in Work Experience
